My wonderful Grandma
Molly went to meet her
Savior twelve years ago when
she was 96. She was a humble
woman who walked faithfully
with her Lord. For days
before she died, she lay in
bed praying and thanking
God for His love for her. As
we sat at her bedside and her
eyes were closed, she told us
to "take care of the children."
Although we were never sure
which children she meant, she
said this repeatedly. She also

talked about the beautiful sound of the lambs. She mentioned how sweet they were, and how their "baa-baa" sounded so precious. Even though we reminded her that there were no lambs nearby, she insisted, "Can't you hear them?" Although this was twelve years ago, these memories remain close in my heart. Every time I see a picture of a lamb, I immediately think of my grandma.

A few years ago when I was in Guatemala, I heard about a church inviting neighborhood children for breakfast on Sunday mornings. After breakfast, the children would attend Sunday School. The church was feeding the children's bodies physically and then feeding them spiritually with a lesson about Christ. Although this did not seem possible for the Amigos Church in Peronia, the idea remained in my heart.

When I visited the Amigos Church in October 2018, I was thrilled to witness Mayra, the pastor's wife, teaching Sunday School! I realized she had a heart for ministering to the com-

munity, and my heart was stirred. It seemed the time was right to begin providing breakfast for area children and inviting them to Sunday School.

On November 18, 2018, a new ministry was born at the Amigos Church. God had faithfully provided a gift which allowed Mayra to cook black beans and eggs for breakfast. Twenty-five children heard about Jesus that morning!

A short time later, I began thinking of how my grandma would be thrilled that these children were being cared for. Tears filled my eyes as God planted the idea of naming the ministry "Ovejitas de Jesús" ("Little Lambs of Jesus"). Now, each Sunday morning at the Amigos Church, as many as 48 children enjoy

breakfast, activities, and the Word of God. Sixteen women of the church help cook, organize games, and teach Bible lessons. Teens of the church are being trained and discipled to

work with the children.

Our prayer is that more and more neighborhood children and their parents will be reached for Jesus. In John 21:15-19, Jesus tells Peter to "Feed my lambs...Tend my sheep...Feed my sheep..." Follow me. "This is happening in Peronia, and my heart is happy as I feel certain that my grandma's wishes are coming true, and that her legacy lives on.
